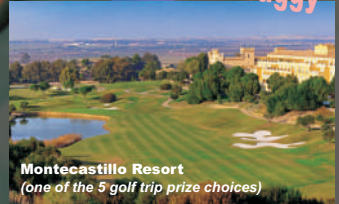

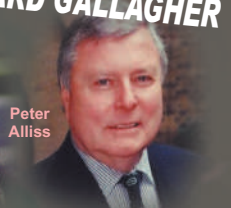

"The day our son Daniel suffered a spinal cord injury in a swimming accident at the age of 19, his life and ours changed immediately and radically". David Nicholls, firmly established as one of the world's finest hotel chefs, has resolved to see Daniel walk again.

The Nicholls Spinal Injury Foundation is dedicated to raising funds to:

- * Expand spinal injury research and development
- * Encourage stem-cell research and surgery
- * Promote post-cure rehabilitation for spinal injury patients

Jennifer Shah contracted cervical cancer in 1981 and was given three months to live. She, with twelve other similarly diagnosed patients at Christies Hospital in Manchester, were treated with a heavy dose of radiation followed by chemo-therapy. The majority of them lived and became the first group in the world to survive cervical cancer.

"Twenty years later, the damage done by the massive dose of radiation (a smaller amount is now used in treatment) resulted in spinal damage which affected Jennifer's nerves in her legs" explains husband Eddy Shah. "Although living between a pair of crutches and a wheelchair, she refuses to give in to her disability and runs The Wiltshire Golf and Country Club as a full-time director and General Manager. She also runs a home for her family including cooking a full meal every night".
